1. Artillery	At flags in Blue & Gray Park 1st Light Artillery will speak about how to fire a cannon and the importance of cannons to battle.
2. Covered Bridge	Walk through self-guided tour of bridge South bound lane of bridge is open to pedestrian traffic. Outside walkway is open.
3. Barbour County Historic Museum	Museum will be open during the day for student tours. Admission to Museum is free. Admission to see Philippi Mummies is \$1 per person. If writing check for visiting mummies, make check out to Barbour County Historical Museum.
